BLACKJACK

The object is to draw cards that total 21 or come closer to 21 than the dealer. All cards are at face value, except for the king, queen and jack, which count as 10. An ace has a value of 11, unless that gives a player or the dealer a score in excess of 21, in which case it has a value of 1.

The dealer starts the game. Each player gets two cards, face up. The dealer gets two cards, with one card face down (hole card). Only after all players' hands are played does the dealer disclose the hole card and play the dealer's hand.

Once you have your two cards in front of you, you can choose to stand (draw no more cards), or take a hit (draw one or more cards) until you reach 21 or come as close as possible. If you go over 21, you break and automatically lose. A winning hand pays even money and winning blackjack pays 3 to 2 or 6 to 5.

Blackjack Terms

SPLITTING PAIRS – If your first two cards are a pair with the same numerical value, you may split them. You must bet the same amount as your original wager on each hand formed by splitting a pair.

DOUBLING DOWN – After you get your first two cards, or on the first two cards of any split pair, you may make an additional wager up to the original amount except when your first two cards total 21. When doubling down you draw only one additional card.

INSURANCE – If the dealer's face-up card is an ace, and prior to anyone receiving additional cards, you can take insurance. To do this you place a bet no more than one-half your original bet on the insurance line. If the dealer's hole card is a 10, jack, queen or king, you win your insurance bet at odds of 2 to 1. If the dealer's hole card is any other card, you lose your insurance bet.

HANDLING OF CARDS – Players are not allowed to touch the cards.

VALUE OF THE PLAYER'S HAND – The player is responsible for the correct count of his or her hand.

HAND SIGNALS – The player is responsible for the proper use of hand signals to indicate hit or stand.

Optional Side Bets Offered in Blackjack

- The optional side bets wagers will be placed in area separate from the blackjack wager and designated for individual side bet.
- Players must place a blackjack wager if they place an additional side bet wager.
- Players may not place a wager on another players side bet wager.

Lucky Ladies' Pay Table if the player's first 2 cards total 20

This payable will be used for non-pitch games

Queen of hearts pair and dealer blackjack.....	1,000 To 1
Queen of hearts pair.....	125 To 1
Matched 20.....	19 To 1
Suited 20.....	9 To 1
Any 20.....	4 to 1

Blazing Sevens Pay Table if players first 2 up cards contain at least one 7 card pay table

Three suited 7's of diamonds.....	100% Of The Mega Progressive
Three suited 7's of hearts, spades, or clubs..	100% Of The Major Progressive
Three 7's of the same color.....	100% Of The Minor Progressive
Three 7's.....	200 for 1
Two 7's.....	25 for 1
One 7.....	2 for 1

Bonus Spin Pay Table if the player has blackjack

\$1,000 symbol.....	\$1,000
\$350 symbol.....	\$350
\$120 symbol.....	\$120
\$50 symbol.....	\$50
\$23 symbol.....	\$23
\$15 symbol.....	\$15
\$10 symbol.....	\$10

Ace card in player's first 2 cards gets even money
